

## Beautiful Wedding.

The wedding of Miss Julia Buchy to Rev. Leopold Scheduling was solemnized at the German Lutheran church on East Fourth street last evening. The church was crowded with invited guests and the altar a profusion of palms and white chrysanthemums shown off by the lights of the chancel presented a vision of beauty not to be forgotten.

Promptly at 7:30, after an organ prelude to the beautiful music of Mendelsohn's wedding march, the bride on the arm of the maid of honor, Miss Anna Grossman, the groom with the best man, Gustave Buchy, preceded by Miss Louise Buchy, maid of honor, and Mr. Carl Rasor, groomsman, marched down the aisle to the altar. After a most impressive talk in German the ceremony was performed by Rev. E. E. Ortlepp, using the double ring ceremony. To those understanding the German language the service was realistic, while those not knowing the speech could only gaze in awe at the splendid scene, the church in darkness and the altar and chancel brilliantly lit with the floral decorations.

The ceremony was over by 8 o'clock and the happy couple were whirled away to the home of the bride's mother at 322 East Water street where a reception was given to about 100 guests.

Rev. and Mrs. Scheduling will remain in this city until Monday after which they will be at home in Medford, Wis., where the former is pastor of the German Lutheran church.
